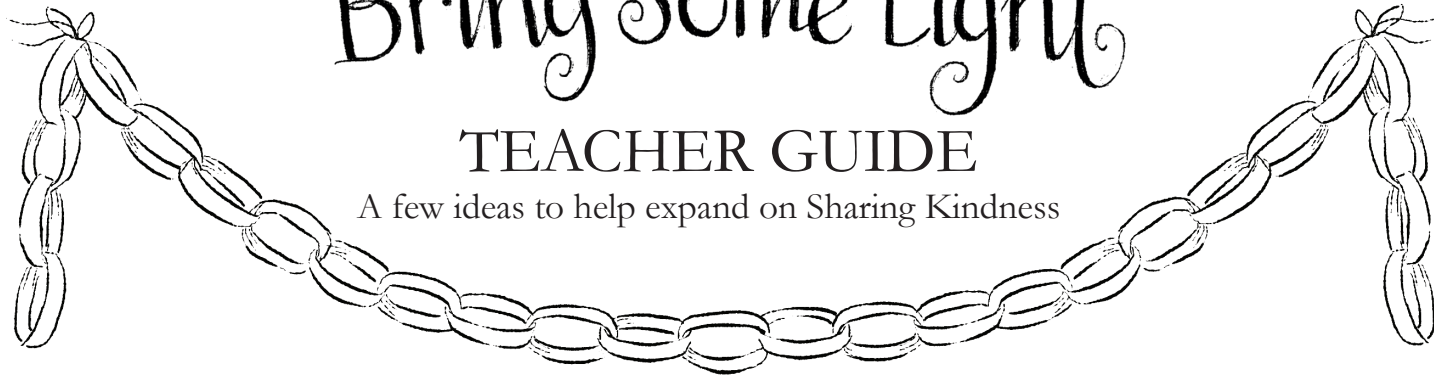


# Share Some Kindness, Bring Some Light

## TEACHER GUIDE

A few ideas to help expand on Sharing Kindness

### 100th Day of School Kindness Challenge:

Create a “Chain of Kindness.” Every time a student does something kind (or sees someone else doing something kind) they can add a paper link to the chain. Try to reach 100 acts of kindness by the 100th Day of School (which is often in February) or National Random Acts of Kindness Day on February 17th.

### Kindness Booklet or Worksheets:

Combine all 3 pages of the Kindness Booklet to create the full project, or use the single page worksheets. Printables come with dotted mid-lines for younger students, or standard lines for older students. *(Please Note: The interior pages should be copied back-to-back. The booklet is made from 2 full pages of paper folded in half.)*

### Kindness Bingo:

Have the students brainstorm a kindness list, then randomly fill in a Kindness Bingo Card Printable. Trade completed cards with another student. First one to fill in a line wins!

### Tiny Book:

Perfect for PreK & K + covers 3 Standards!

### Star of the Week Book:

Include the kindness theme with your Student of the Week. The Star Student can draw their self portrait on the “Star of the Week” Book Cover Printable. Fellow students can write what they appreciate about the Star Student, or call out acts of kindness they’ve seen from the Star Student. Bind together for a keepsake.

### Kindness Cards:

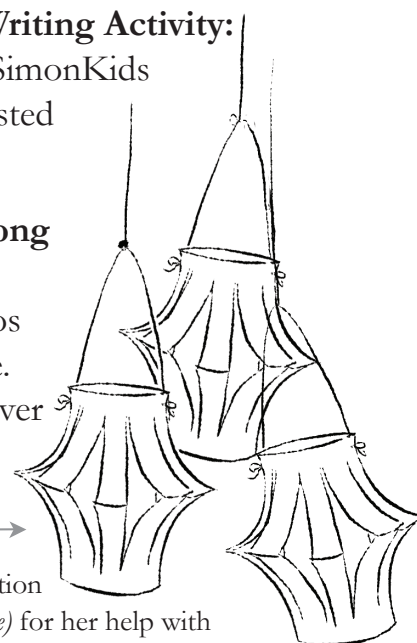
Print a stack of Kindness Cards Printables. Students can leave secret kindness notes to each other, staff and their families.
